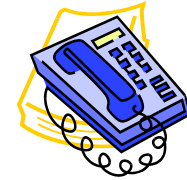

Overview

Individuals with traumatic brain injury (TBI) can be employed successfully and productively if the appropriate accommodations are in place and if employment specialists are knowledgeable about all aspects of traumatic brain injuries. In this teleconference, Dr. Owens will overview what the employment specialist should know to facilitate success for the employee and the employer. She will discuss:

- Neuropsychological reports—how to interpret them and why they are important

- Job placement and development for a person with TBI
- Providing workplace supports to the employee with TBI
- Best practices and lessons learned
- Resources that employment specialists can use for learning more about individuals with TBI

Laura Owens teaches courses in curricular accommodations, career and vocational education, and transition from school to adult life. She presents internationally on these topics. In 1991 she founded Creative Employment Opportunities, an employment agency for individuals with disabilities, and in 2001 she founded ArtWorks for Milwaukee, a non-profit job-training program in the arts for individuals with disabilities.

She currently serves on the national board of the Association for Persons in Supported Employment (APSE). Laura earned her master's degree in special education from UWM and her doctoral degree from UW-Madison.
